For students, interview preparation is a valuable learning opportunity.

It will give them experience and confidence, and practicing interview skills will allow them to focus on connecting with the interviewer rather than fighting to come up with a response during the actual interview. With the importance of interviews in mind, the KMEA Language Forum held an online interview challenge.

It was a two–day online event held via Google Meet on May 22nd and 23rd, 2021, with nearly 30 students from various branches or schools participating. For the event, there were participants from various schools and colleges. Three interviewers were assigned to each interviewee to assist them in determining their strengths and weaknesses. Each participant was assigned a 10-minute time period to arrive at the meet and participate in the event.

There were three portions to the interview questions. The first session was used to introduce themselves as well as the biodata they had provided for the interview. The second session consisted of technical questions designed to assess their academic expertise. The third session consisted of presenting them an example of hiring them in company and asking questions about hiring them and what a firm can accept from the applicant.

The majority of the contestants gave it their all, but three students in particular stood out, and they were named the event's winners. The first prize went to Jadeed Kamal from S2 EC, the second prize went to Varsha Shaheen (XII grade student), and the third prize went to Fahima Noushad (S2 CE–MACE).

The preliminary round had 16 teams, with four teams progressing to the semi-final round and the top two teams progressing to the final round. The competition was judged by a total of eight judges (teaching staff), as well as four moderators.

The competition was worth enjoying for the audience. Every debater was cheered and clapped up for their pleasing presentation and sharp arguments. HackWithInfy is a competitive coding competition for second-year to pre-final year students across India. In this competition, participants have to solve coding questions in a given time and top performers get a chance to interview Infosys. Hackwithinfy (HWI) is for B.Tech / M.Tech-2022 students graduating in the year 2022 across India. The program is specially designed to inculcate the culture of rapid problem-solving and innovative thinking early in academic life. A total of 96 students attended the program.

HackWithInfy provides the perfect stepping stone for students to explore their interest in programming and an opportunity to compete and win exciting prizes. The top performers will also earn a chance to work with Infosys.

HackWithInfy comprises two rounds with Round 1 as an individual online test and grand finale. This year HackWithInfy is not just open to the final year engineering students but also for the second- and third-year engineering students in India to prove their mettle and win exciting cash prizes worth INR 3.5 lakhs. An individual applicant or team participating in Infosys Limited's ('Company') HackWithInfy ('Event') shall be referred to as a 'participant or participants'. By registering to participate in the Event, the participants acknowledge and agree to the following terms and conditions (hereinafter referred to as 'HackWithInfy's terms and conditions').  platform for engineering students in India. Students who are already registered on InfyTQ can
 apply for HackWithInfy by clicking on the HackWithInfy program banner on the InfyTQ
 homepage. Students who have not joined InfyTQ can download the app either from the Google
 Play Store or from the iOS App Store. Students can also visit the InfyTQ website to experience
 the platform and register for HackWithInfy.
- By registering for HackWithInfy on InfyTQ, the participant agrees to allow Infosys to retrieve participant's information, including without limitation, name, email address, institute, contact number, city, state, highest qualification, specialization, date of birth, gender, and passport size picture, passing year, etc. from the platform and share it with the internal teams of the Company or the Event and other necessary purposes as deemed necessary by Company.
- The HackWithInfv will be conducted in two rounds:
 - i. Round 1: March 6, 7, and 8, 2022 An online individual participation round on Infosys Assessment Platform.
 - ii. Final Round: July 1 July 4, 2022 The 48-hour hackathon among teams and the Grand Finale.

The top 100 participants from Round 1 will compete in the four-day grand finale in July 2022. The finalists will also get an opportunity for a pre-placement interview and internships for the niche technical roles at Infosys.

Report of the Event: (Minimum 500 Words)

An event on Importance of Effective Communication by an eminent person from English and Foreign Languages University, Hyderabad was conducted on 29th March, 2021 from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM. The English and Foreign Languages University (EFLU), the first language institute in the country was established to improve the standards of teaching English in the country. The Institute was the brainchild of the first Prime Minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. The institute was first set up in the year 1958 in Hyderabad with the name Central Institute of English and gave training to the teachers of English. Later, in the year 1972, April, the institute decided to enlarge its scope and include other foreign languages as its course. CIEFL becomes an English and Foreign Languages University in 2007. Hence, it was a good initiative by the CGPU of KMEA to conduct a session with an eminent person from a university like EFLU. There were no eligibility criteria for attending the session, thus all the students from S8 batch could attended the session. A total of 216 students attended the program. As we know that engineers have to communicate on a daily basis - with each other, with supervisors, with people in different departments, and even with clients. Their work is complex and technical, but not everyone they work with has the same technical expertise, which makes it even more important for them to have good communication skills. Effective communication in engineering is critical to ensuring that all project participants are on the same page. Therefore, this session may have greatly helped our students to understand the importance of effective communication in industry and placements.

The main objectives of the programme were

- to enlighten participants on ways to communicate effectively,
- to demonstrate to and educate participants on various methods of communication
- to provide an action plan to overcome barriers to communication.

The following were some of the areas that were covered during the session.

- What is Communication?
- The importance of good communication
- Types and methods of Communication Formal and Informal Communication (Channels of Communication)

- Understanding your responsibility in the communication process
- Communication (verbal & non-verbal)
- Key skills of effective communication
- Communication Barriers Methods to overcome communication barriers
- Making and dealing with criticisms (constructive)
- Making effective decisions Team Building

Due to the nature of the workshop, and to effectively enhance our students, the facilitator opted for the combination methodology of lecturing and practical/demonstrative exercises. This method held the attention of our students who displayed an eagerness to increase their knowledge by participating fully throughout the duration of the session. When an evaluation of the session was carried out, it revealed some benefits of the session to our students.

- Though students were previously exposed to the subject area, they indicated that the
 format and the content of the workshop allowed them to further understand the
 importance of effective communication.
- Some students viewed the workshop as a refresher to their knowledge while others
 engaged in new learning and upgraded on a professional basis, their limited
 knowledge of the subject.
- The Facilitator came with a wealth of knowledge on the subject and was rated as quite knowledgeable.

Report of the Event: (Minimum 500 Words)

We live in an online world with the digital divide closing up through government initiative. Universities and colleges have a responsibility to develop students who can thrive in an era of digital information and communication. Those who are digitally literate are more likely to be economically secure and these skills are especially important in higher education given that graduate white collar jobs are almost entirely performed on computers and portable devices. Digital literacy is about being empowered and confident to live, learn and work in a digital society. Digital information is becoming essential to almost every aspect of modern life which means that there is a need as never before. Digital information literacy requires a degree of skill like using computers and the Internet for many aspects of study at this level, for example, enrolment, accessing online course materials, preparing assignments, checking grades and communicating with teachers. Hence, a webinar was conducted by CGPU with Infosys on 23rd March of 2021 from 3:00 pm to 4:00pm. The resource person of the webinar was A B pandit, Project Lead of Infosys. Training was his area of expertise, and he has rich knowledge and experience in the academic fields also. After the session, our students got aware of the importance of digital literacy. Some of the action points emerging from the webinar are:

- Encouraging self-learning
- Differentiating between misinformation or opinion-based content and fact-based content.
- Importance of learner generated e-learning content
- Community participation for narrowing the digital divide
- Nurturing Netiquette
- Developing curriculum based on simulation and game-based learning, augmented reality and virtual reality.

Our students got benefit from a rich knowledge base and also could extended to their family members too. All without any cost. The objective was very simple and obvious, that's to jumpstart the Digital Literacy of the curious minds in this country. A total of 98 students attended the program.
